Electrical Engineering (EE) students from Mountain Province State University (MPSU) are extending their energy conservation campaign beyond the campus walls. As part of a new extension activity, the students have announced the "Light for Life" program, a community outreach initiative set to begin in 2025.

The student-led program will offer free workshops for local community members on practical, low-cost ways to improve energy efficiency at home.

"We are teaching families how to read their electric bills, the benefits of switching to LED lights, and how to reduce 'phantom load' from appliances," said a student coordinator for the program. "This is a direct transfer of knowledge that empowers our neighbors, reduces costs for households, and helps our entire province conserve energy."
