

Campus Accessibility at Mountain Province State University

Mountain Province State University has invested in a specific array of physical facilities to support accessibility for persons with disabilities, those with special needs, and individuals seeking maternity care. Ramps for persons with disabilities are distributed across campus, ensuring that students and staff who use mobility aids can access buildings and spaces without obstruction. Elevators equipped with handrails are available for moving between floors, and additional handrails line stairways and corridors to provide stable support and prevent slips or falls. Priority lanes have been established at frontline offices, so individuals with accessibility requirements can conduct their transactions efficiently and comfortably without unnecessary waiting.

Within the University Health Services, special entrances have been assigned for maternity care, making health services accessible not just physically but in a way that respects the privacy and unique needs of expecting mothers. Comfort rooms designated for persons with disabilities are located in key areas across the campus, designed specifically to meet standards for accessibility and to ensure both hygiene and dignity for users. The university's facilities include spaces for medical needs and breastfeeding, which further demonstrate its holistic approach to wellness and inclusion.

These features point to an institution that goes beyond compliance, striving to craft a campus environment where all are empowered to participate fully and safely in both educational and workplace activities.
